It has the functions of local preview,multi-split screen displays and local real video file storage capabilities.If also supports for mouse shortcuts,and has remote management and control functions.The product supports both the client front-end storage and client storage.This series DVR can not only be used independently,but also be networked to form a powerful Digitalmonitoring center.It has been widely used in domestic and foreign banks, telecom,power,justice,transport,community,factories,warehouses resources, water conservancy facilities etc. Areas and departments security.In addition,it also plays an important role in home security monitoring system.





2.3 Mouse Instructions

Mouse instruction

Operate DVR through mouse left button, right button & scroll wheel.

Mouse actions	Function
Click left mouse button	1. Select one of the options; 2. insertion cursor, enter or modify the value of a parameter.
Click right mouse button	1. When interface not locking , click right mouse button, system menu pops up; 2. When interface locking, click right button on real-time preview interface, login interface pop up ; 3. Entered to main menu, to a submenu of PTZ control, click right mouse button on the menu interface, return to previous menu (except video playback interface); 4. Entered to close system interface, click mouse right button on the interface, return to preview interface.
Double-click the mouse left button	1. When real-time preview multiple channels interface, double-click maximized channel display of one channel and return to the original state; 2. Double click the password input field on the login interface; 3. setting parameters (date, time, IP address, port number, bit stream value and user password) or user names
mouse movements	Select the menu or menu item.
Mouse drag	Drag progress bar to playback video.
Slide mouse scroll wheel	1.Time setting; 2.Select the drop-down menu values;

2.4 Remote controls

The remote control is the secondary input device.

To use the remote control:

1. **STANDBY**: Press to turn standby mode ON/OFF.

2. **LOGIN/LOCK**: If "Security" has been enabled in the Setup menu, press to open the user password login screen.

3. **Number/Channel buttons**: While in menus, press buttons 0~9 to enter values; during live viewing, press to view channels in full-screen.

4. **Multiple-window switch**: Press to switch between Single and split-screen displays.

5. **PTZ**: Press to open the PTZ control Interface.

6. **MENU**: Opens the main menu.

7. **EXIT**: Close menu windows.

8. **Navigation/Enter**:

- ▲: Move cursor in menus up;
- ►: Move cursor in menus right;
- ◀: Move cursor in menus left;
- ▼: Move cursor in menus down;

9. **+/-**: In menus, press to adjust values.

10. **Playback controls**:

- ►: Press to start playback.
- ►►: Press to increase forward playback speed 2X, 4X, 8X.
- ►►►: Press to slow playback speed by 1/2, 1/4, 1/8.
- ◀◀: Increase reverse playback speed 2X, 4X, 8X.
- ■: Pause or frame by frame playback picture; press for the first time to pause playback image; then continue continuous press, a second one frame every player;


11. **STOP**: Press to stop playback.

12. **RECORD**: Press to start manual recording, then press again to stop manual recording.

13. **MUTE**: Close live audio output.

14. **AUDIO**: Enter the volume control interface.

15. **EXTRA**: For the future use.

Input method includes lowercase and uppercase English letters. Clicking the Shift button on the left can switch the input method and the symbol "←" represents deleting incorrect input.




3.1 Hard Disk Installation

Hard Disk Installation:


- (1) Loosen the fixing screw on the cover, open the cover.




- (2) Align the four holes of hard disk button with hard disk mounting hole at the button of chassis.



- (3) Hold the hard disk with hand, turn over the chassis, fix the hard disk with screw at the indicated position.



- (4) After hard disk installed, turn over the chassis, fix the cover with screw.




Note: 1. If user requires high performance of hard disk, we recommend the dedicated security hard disk.

2. Before replacing the hard disk, please shut off the power first and then open the case.

3.2 Device Connection

Show the DVR signal on the monitor by VGA / BNC / HDMI cable. If the camera possible PTZ control, contacting the PTZ RS485 cable A and cable B contact with the DVR RS485.



4 DVR Startup

4.1 System Initialization

After connecting the device to the display, plug in the mouse, power cable and turn on the power switch on the rear panel, then start up the DVR. The system initialization interface is as shown in Figure 4-1.

4.2 Boot wizard

After the device startup is complete, load the "Wizard" screen, as shown in Figure 4-2, you can make a simple configuration via the boot wizard, you can make the device into the normal working condition.

After the normal startup, if you not choice the checkbox it will not appear next time. User find it at normal setting menu, or setting it after factory default.



4.2.1 Login authentication

After the normal startup, click mouse button and there will be a login dialogue, as shown in Figure 4-3 Then enters the user name and password in the input box.Choose the system language and login. (In the factory default state, the user name is admin, and the password is 12345)





4.3 Preview Interface

After the system is fully booted, it will enter into the default preview interface, shown in Figure 4-7.

After the device normally starts up, the default setting is to preview in multi-screen display mode. Products with different channels has different amount of split screens to display. On the preview interface, you can set the appropriate date and time. On the bottom left of the screen, it shows the recording status of each video channel or alarm status icon.

- : this icon means monitoring channel is recording;
- : this icon means monitoring channel is in motion detection.

5 DVR Menu

5.1 Menu Options

After login the system and back on the preview interface, click the right mouse button and it will pop up the Menu Options, shown in Figure 5-1. Then you can select options of the Main Menu, Volume Settings, the Main Screen Switching, Playback, PTZ Control and System Shutdown. In addition, you can set the channel display as follows: single-screen display, four-screen display, eight-screen display, night-screen display. It needs to set a specific number of channels to achieve single-screen display, four-screen display, etc.. The corresponding operation of the Main Menu Options will be illustrated in details in later chapters.



- **Single-screen Display:** Select one channel to display from CH1~CH16 .
- **Four-screen Display:** Divided into four groups to display (CH1~CH4、CH5~CH8、CH9 ~CH12、CH13~CH16).
- **Eight-screen Display:** Divided into two groups to display (CH1~CH8、CH9 ~CH16).
- **Sixteen-screen Display:** Display all channels CH1 ~CH16.
- **Volume:** Click to enter the volume setting interface, See chapter 5.1.1.
- **Zoom:** Choose Digital zoom function in the channel you want and drag the left mouse button to choose one area on this channel. When you release the left button, the chosen area will be digitally zoomed. Drag in any direction is supported.
- **Poll:** Enter Tour Settings Interface. When there are several dissociative windows, you can set single or mutipal windows to tour different groups simultaneously.
- **Record Backup:** Enter Video backup Interface and insert the USB Disk. Then choose the channel and date that you want to back up the videos.
- **Image Color:** Click into the image color configuration interface. See chapter 5.3.3.9.

- **Playback:** Click into the Playback interface, See chapter 5.3.1.
- **PTZ Setup:** Click to enter PTZ control configuration menu, See chapter 5.3.3.6.
- **Main Menu:** Click and enter the main menu, See chapter 5.3.

5.1.1 Volume Settings

Click right month button on the preview screen, select the volume option on the shortcut menu, enter the volume setting menu, shown in Figure 5-2.




- **Mute:** ON/OFF volume.
- **Volume:** Volume adjustment bar, drag the slider to adjust the volume.

5.3 Main Menu

Main Menu includes Record Query, System Info, System Setup, Advance Option, Shutdown five parts, as shown in Figure 5-3. Select one and click the left mouse button to open the corresponding next menu options.



5.3.1 Record Query

After entering the main menu, open the "Record Query" menu or right-click to choose select "right-click" menu in the preview interface, switch to video query interface, shown in Figure 5-4.



No.	Name	Function Specification
1	Calendar	In any play mode, select the recording type and channel number, click on the date you want to view, the timeline will update the recorded video for that day.
2	Choose the Playback Channel	Select the channel number to query.
3	File List transfer button	Select the date, channel number and record type, click into the video file list. Select the desired video file, double-click the left mouse button to start playing the video file.
4	Backup	Backup video file, the default format to avi
5	Playback Control Area	On the playback control bar, you can normally play, pause, fast forward, fast forward playback mode, you can select 1×, 2×, 4×, 8×, 16×, 1×which is played at normal speed;
6	Timeline	Query to the video file, updated for the day that recording tracks on the timeline. Under the four-frame playback mode, display the selected four channels corresponding to four playback timeline, other playback mode displays only one playback timeline. Click on the green area to start from that point of time for playback.
7	Select video type	Select the type of video, you can choose the type for all types of video, timed recording, alarm recording and detection recording.
8	Timeline unit selection	Including 24h, 2h, 1h and 30min, the smaller units of time the greater the proportion of time zoom, you can adjust the exact point in time to play back video on the timeline. If the page is in the configuration, the timeline is 0:00 start amplification; if the page is being played, the places within the scope of the current playing time recently enlarged.

In the file list bar, you can see the start time of the video file, video type, select a video file, you can view the video of recording start time, end time and file size, as shown in Figure 5-5.



In the file list box, click to choose the video file selection box , showed icon "√", click this icon  to backup the video files (external U disk), the files are "avi" format. You could also click to choose multiple video files selection box to backup those video files, users can also cancel this icon "√" in the backup operation menu in the file list box, delete those video files that unwanted.

5.3.2 System Information

Left-click the icon of "Info" in the main menu, shown as Figure 5-6 below, including "Log info" and "Version" of two sub-menus.



5.3.2.1 Log Information

Under the "Info" menu, please click "Log Info", and then switch to the interface of "Log Info". As shown in Figure 5-7.



Viewing System Logs to access the logs and search for these events on one day a certain period of time.

- **Type:** Select the type of information you request.
- **Start Time/End Time:** Enter the time to find the logs.
- **Search:** Search for logs according to criteria.
- **PgUp/PgDn:** You can view all logs through the PgUp/PgDn.
- **Clear:** Clear all information.
- **Cancel:** Return to the former menu.

Specific Steps: Enter the log search menu, set search parameters, click the Search button to begin search, If logs matching the search criteria are

found, it will be displayed in a list, To view all logs through PgUp/PgDn button.

5.3.2.2 Version Information

Click "Version" icon under "Info", switch to interface as Figure 5-8 shows.



Users can find system version, including serial No, model number, system version, Version Date.

- **Serial No.:** Showing the serial No.of the DVR.
- **Model number:** Number of main board.
- **Version:** System version number.
- **Date:** Program created date.

5.3.3 System Setup

Left-click the icon of "Sys Setup" in the main menu, shown as Figure 5-9 shows.

5.3.3.1 Common Set

Click "Common Config" icon under "Sys Setup", switch to interface as Figure 5-10 shows.



- **System Time** : System date and time of DVR.
- **Default Language** : the default language of the system boot, which is English, but, at present, also supports Chinese, Polish, Czech, Russian, Thai language, Hebrew, Persian, Bulgarian, Arabic, German, French, Portuguese, Turkish, Spanish, Italian, and Hungarian.
- **Record Mode** : Overwrite automatically, ie., DVR will automatically cover the previous record if hard disk is full.
- **Device ID** : Reserved.
- **Video Standard** : PAL or NTSC.

- **Standby Time:** It means standby time of system without operation for DVR. If time exceeds the standby time, then you should re-login in system so as to operate DVR. Default standby time is 30 minutes. And standby time range is: 1 to 120 minutes.
- **Open the wizard:** ☒ means boot the wizard function.
- **Device name:** Set the name of the device.
- **Default :** Restore all specifications or parameters of common setup to be factory default specifications.
- **Save:** To save specifications or parameters of common setup.
- **Cancel :** Return to the former interface.

5.3.3.2 Encoding parameters

Click "Param" icon under "Sys Setup", switch to interface as Figure 5-11 shows. Resolution, Frame Rate, Stream Type, Bit Rate, Sub-stream can be set under "Param" Interface.

- **Channel:** Select the channel number
- **Enc Mode:** Standard H.264.
- **Resolution:** The type of main stream resolution is the encoding parameters of client IPC, generally include D1/720P/1080P etc, the type of sub-stream resolution include D1/VGA/CIF. The resolution is bigger, the better the video quality, and the larger the hard-dish space occupied. On the contrary, the resolution is smaller, the worse the video quality, the smaller the hard-ship space occupied.
- **Frame Rate:** P type: 1 frames / sec-25 frames / sec; N type: 1frames / sec-30frames / sec.
- **Stream type:** Select video stream or audio stream..
- **Bit Rate:** Setting bit rate can change the picture quality, the larger the bit rate and the better the picture quality.

- **main stream/subcode flow frame rate:** User according to the demand to select encoding video frame rate.general the image quality, frame rate and resolution parameters setting higher, the more take up disk space.

Notice: code flow resolution and frame rate is restricted by different type device and program vision.

- **Default:** Recover all the encoding parameter to default values.
- **Save:** Save the parameters on preview configuration menu.
- **Cancel:** Return to the former interface.

Overlay Set

Override the settings interface, as shown in Figure 5-12. Cover Set,Time title, and Channel title can be set under "Overlay Set" Interface.



- **Block set:** Set the channel preview and playback occlude areas.
- **Time tile:** Set the playback channels display position.
- **Channel title:** Set the playback channels system time display position.
- **Save:** Save preview configuration interface setting parameter values.
- **Cancel:** Return the management interface.

5.3.3.3 Rec Setup

Click "Rec Setup" icon under "Sys Setup", switch to interface as Figure 5-13 shows.

- **Default:** Restore all parameters of Digitalsetup to be defaulted ones.
- **Save:** Save parameters of common setup interface.
- **Refresh:** clicking Save to save the parameters to the device after finishing all the parameters setup and click Refresh to acquire the latest configuration information of the device.
- **Cancel:** Cancel the set Digitalof current interface.





















































7 Appendix

7.1 Q&A

1. How to do when can't detect the hard disk?

Answer: If the system does not detect the hard disk, kindly please check the data line and the power line of hard disk whether are connected well, whether there is a problem about the interface of hard disk on the motherboard, or kindly please check hard disk whether is supported by the DVR in specification.

2. After modifying password, what can you do when you forget the password?

Answer: When the administrator forget password, kindly please get in touch with our technical staff. The easy to remember and relatively safe password is recommended when you set the password (if you have security needs, kindly please don't try to set simple passwords such as 123).

3. what results will maybe happen due to the heat when DVR is working?

Answer: It will produce some heat when DVR is working, kindly please put the DVR in the place where is safe and ventilated to stop the stability and life of the system be affected due to long-term high temperature of DVR.

4. Whether can use if i install the hard disk drive of computer to DVR?

Answer: If the hard disk you use can be supported by the system of DVR, it can work, but you need note, if the DVR begins to work, all datas in your hard disk will loss.

5. Whether can playback when recording?

Answer: Yes.

6. Whether can remove a part of video recordings of hard disk of DVR?

Answer: Considering the security of document, you can't remove a part of video recording, if you need remove all video recordings, you can format the hard disk.

7. Why can't login to DVR client?

Answer: Kindly please check configuration of Digitalconnection whether is right, connection of RJ-45 interface whether is fine, if also can't work, kindly please check whether the user name and password are right.

8. Why can't find any recording information when playback?

Answer: Kindly please check whether the connection of data line of hard disk is good, whether the time of system is changed, whether the query condition that is setted can't save video files. If also have the question after restarting, kindly please check whether the hard disk is damaged.

7.2 Maintenance

1. When DVR shutdowns, kindly please don't turn off the power switch directly, should use the shutdown button of system to avoid data loss or damage of the hard disk.
2. Ensure DVR away from high temperature heat source and place.
3. Remove the dust deposited in the body timing, keep the good ventilation around chassis, it is good for radiating.
4. About the audio/video signal line and RS-485 interfaces, kindly please don't hot swap, or these port will be damaged easily.
5. Check the HDD power cable and data cable of the DVR regularly and look whether they are aging.
6. Avoid the audio/video signal effected by other circuits and devices as much as possible, prevent the hard disk damaged by electrostatic or induced voltage.
